

Former Dodgers All-Star Steve Garvey ought to be wearing his glove and spikes to cover all his bases.

Between watching his son, Sean, 12, the youngest of his seven children, play for the Desert Longhorns in this week's Cooperstown (N.Y.) All-Star Village National Championship, Garvey, 62, fielded calls about, well, everything.

"Hold on a second, I've got to sign a baseball," said Garvey by phone from Cooperstown, where he joined Little League families on a private tour Monday of the Baseball Hall of Fame.

"I'm here in the mountains of Cooperstown, my son just hit a home run, I'm at Angel Stadium on Sunday, the All-Star Game on July 12 and Dodger Stadium after that. Baseball is the life."

The popular 10-time All-Star, four-time Gold Glove winner and 1974 NL MVP is getting his former teammates - and Freeway Series rivals together for what he called, "a mature guys - not Old Timers" celebrity softball game set to begin after Sunday's Dodgers-Angels contest at Angel Stadium.

Garvey, a year into his new hip, will reprise his role at first base. He has retired shortstop Bill Russell and catchers Steve Yeager and Todd Zeile back for the Dodgers, and former All-Star second baseman Bobby Grich and 1993 AL Rookie of the Year outfielder Tim Salmon leading the Angels.

Sports and entertainment celebrities, among them NFL quarterback Vince Young, former All-Star slugger Jose Canseco and "61*" actor Thomas Jane, round out the lineups for the threeinning game that raises funds for Lou Gehrig's Disease (Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis).
